# TO MIGHTY REVIVAL!

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Right now we stand on the verge of the mightiest revival of the miraculous the world has ever witnessed. This is the earth-sweeping revival foretold by the Holy Prophets throughout the centuries.

God has always had a people with a vision. "Where there is no vision, the people perish." (Prov. 29:18)

God has always had a people who could hear His voice. Many a time, especially in the Dark Ages, it seemed not a Bible would survive, but God always had a man. After hundreds of years, when it appeared there would be no church left, not a saint of God, not a Christian, GOD FOUND A MAN. God spoke to this man while he was crawling on his hands and knees doing penance: "Luther, the Just shall live by faith!" And Luther heard that voice!

From that time on, here a little, there a little, line upon line, precept upon precept, God has been bringing His people out of darkness — not all at once, but a little at a time.

"Whom shall He teach knowledge? and whom shall He make to understand doctrine? Them that are weaned from the milk and drawn from the breasts." (Isaiah 28:9) God is looking for people today who will get away from mama's breast. They have had milk long enough.

God wants to feed the church strong meat. Now we have had a little meat since God began to pour out of His Spirit, back in the early nineteen hundreds, and people began to be baptised with the Holy Ghost and Fire.

I have long declared that the Pentecostal Churches didn't have it all, and now I am persuaded of it beyond a shadow of a doubt. They have another step to take.

The church was in total darkness during those four hundred years of the Dark Ages, and it appeared that Catholicism would rule the world. But Luther took one step out of darkness and established the Lutheran church. Then God began to let the people know that it would take more than one step for the church to come completely out of darkness.

He raised up the Wesleys, Fletcher, and many others since Luther began to preach "The Just shall live by faith." Step by step, or shall I say switch by switch, God began to turn the lights on, and the church began to come out of darkness.

Along about the year 1900 she took another step and God began to fill her with the Holy Ghost. And the Baptists, the Methodists, the Presbyterians, the Lutherans — people of all

denominations — began to receive the Holy Ghost, to speak in tongues, and, in a sense, believe in healing and to pray for the sick.

But they did not teach very much about miracles, such as raising the dead, or God restoring parts that had been removed by surgery or missing from birth.

About ten years ago, God just threw a revival into the lap of one of the largest Pentecostal denominations in the world, and they cried, "We will have nothing to do with it!" They began to fight those who preached signs, wonders and miracles, and to persecute and ridicule them, branding them as radicals and fanatics, in false doctrine.

Right now the church is still one step too far back. She should have taken that last step ten or fifteen years ago. If the Pentecostal churches won't come on out and take the final step that will bring Jesus back — preach this gospel with signs and wonders and miracles around the world — the Lord will just leave them out. But some WILL take that last step!

History has a way of repeating itself. It has always been that the "Pharisees" of the last revival persecute the prophets of the next revival. When God began to pour out His spirit about the year 1900, who was it that fought the Pentecostal people and speaking in tongues? The people who had been sanctified and were called Holiness people.

But the Pentecostal people took thier stand and kept on speaking in tongues and receiving the Baptism of the Holy Ghost.

When they got to the place they didn't do much of that, God began to raise up prophets of a new revival and the old "Pharisees" of the last revival, one step too far back, began to persecute the prophets of the new revival.

Today, the Pentecostal people do no have the revival that is going to bring Jesus back, because when that revival comes, it will do more than build walls around God's sheep, and the preachers will do more than fuss and fight, quarrel and criticize, find fault and murmur against the prophets of the new revival.

Sitting around, doing nothing, are many who at one time were outstanding Pentecostal evangelists who once drew huge crowds and preached holiness more emphatically than anyone else. They have failed because they would not come on out and move on with God, and they are going to be left behind just as those who failed to follow the cloud and the fire in the wilderness were left behind, unless they move on out. They are one step too far back. Their light has become darkness, and the "Pharisees" of the last revival are once

again persecuting the prophets of the new revival.

The church is going to have to take one more step, and we began to take that step about five years ago. God promised me that we are going to see some of the greatest revivals and the most miraculous works that the world has ever witnessed.

Two years ago when we set our big white tent up in Atlanta, Georgia, God promised through the supernatural gifts of utterance that we would see greater miracles under that tent than we had ever seen. And it became a fact! But we have not yet experienced the great things that God has for them that fear Him and love Him.

God has been talking to me in recent months about something! I am praying and meditating about it every waking hour. I am talking about it and writing about it. We are publishing it in news articles and in Miracle Magazine. We are putting it on radio and on our nationwide telecasts.

What is it? That God in this day and this hour has more than just a few healings and just a few miracles for His church! That we are on the verge of the greatest thing that God will ever do! That God is going to give us a sweeping revival of the miraculous and even our teenagers will open the eyes of the blind, empty wheelchairs, cast out devils, and cleanse the leper!

And more than that: I believe they are going to RAISE THE DEAD! Do you believe it?

I also believe you are hungering and thirsting after this, and many of you are going to take that one last step. If you stay one step back, you will be as far from the Move of God as those who have stayed back where Luther came out. You better move on out.

I repeat there is one more step! God is going to have a church and the gates of hell shall not prevail against it. (Matt. 16:18)

Some of you know, deep down in your hearts, that God wants to do something that He has never done for you but you are so tied and bound and fettered, so glued in your tracks that you can't take that step you have thought about taking.

You are afraid of the general superintendent or the presbyter, the sectional presbyter, or the district superintendent. You are afraid of losing a little piece of paper — your license or ordination paper — and afraid you will lose prestige, afraid your ministry will not stand in the sight of God. You have to depend on man to give you a church and you have to depend on popularity and the applause of the people. You

have to depend on promotions from your overseer or somebody else.

But my Bible says: "Promotion cometh neither from the east, nor from the west, nor from the south, but God is the judge: he putteth down one, and setteth up another." (Psalm 75:6, 7) So promotion comes from the Lord.

Some of you ministers would have been preaching to thousands today, would have had a successful ministry, but you are tied down. You are in bondage and in captivity. But deep down in your heart you know that you need to take one more step.

Why don't you just take it NOW? Come on out. If you don't, God will leave you where He left the other denominational churches. They are cold and dry and dead and formal. And even in many a Pentecostal church today, you don't hear speaking in tongues and manifestations of the gifts — prophecy, discerning of spirits, healing, and miracles.

But God is going to have some Pentecostal people who will take one more step.

I am expecting this revival to reach worldwide proportions. I know it! God is talking to me!

God is going to take the church through. Do you want to go through with her? It will be more than a few healings, more than a few wheel chairs emptied, more than a few stretchers vacated, more than a few cancers dropping off, a few blind eyes restored, a few deaf ears opened. It will be the **RAISING OF THE DEAD! MASS MIRACLES!**

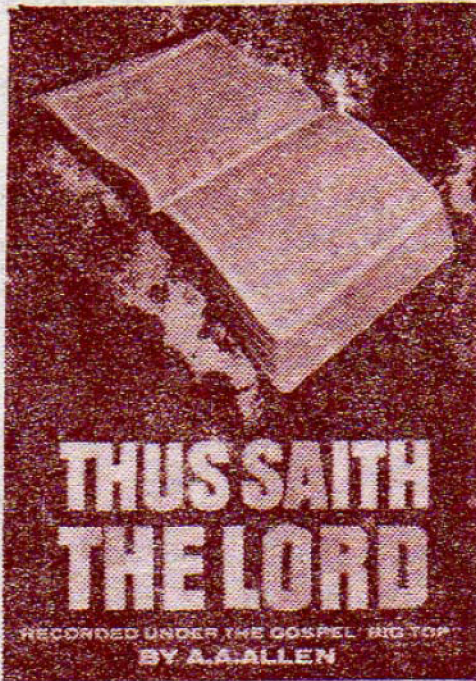
